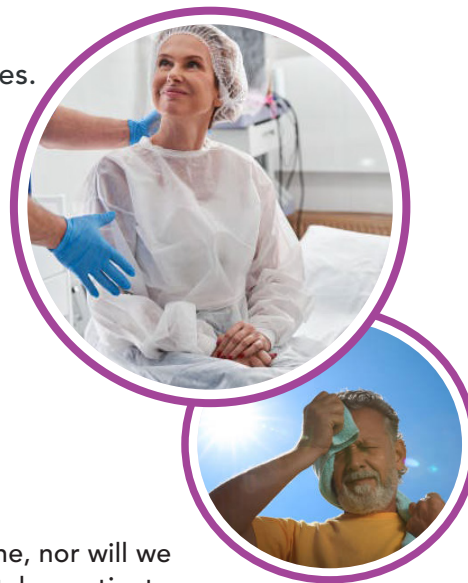


What is the National Hospital Care Survey?
