Boundary and Annexation Survey

The Census Bureau is adding a feedback component to its geographic partnership programs to allow for the solicitation of feedback to improve the administration of the respective program and potentially reduce the future burden. Eligible governments may be asked to provide their feedback on materials, method(s) of data collection, manner of communications, and the usability of the program applications and tools. For the Boundary and Annexation Survey, the feedback component may apply to a maximum of 1,000 eligible governments.

2. Tell us about your experience using GUPS Web. What functionality did you like? What do you think could be improved?
3. Tell us about your experience using the Geography Division Partner Portal. What functionality did you like? What do you think could be improved?
