Surveys conducted before the workshop will document CBO participants' baseline levels of understanding of their roles in identifying environmental concerns and developing projects to address these issues. The baseline results will be compared to levels of understanding measured by surveys after the workshop. concerns.

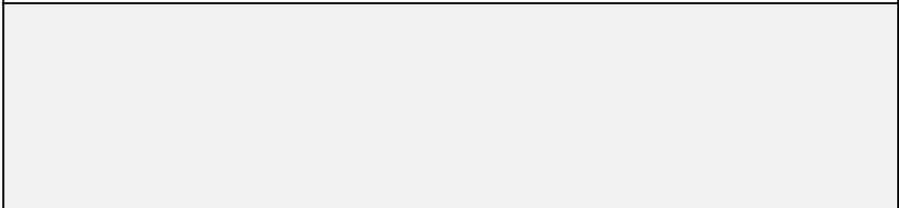
