






Traveler existing form





➤ Who is required to complete an I-736 form?

Citizens or nationals from one of the twelve countries participating in the Guam and Commonwealth of Northern Marianas Islands (CNMI) visa waiver program (Australia, Brunei, Hong Kong, Japan, Malaysia, Nauru, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, South Korea, Singapore, Taiwan and the United Kingdom) who travel to Guam or CNMI are required, with a few exceptions, to present a signed paper copy of the I-736 form upon arrival. For any of the following conditions, an I-736 is not required:

- 1. If a traveler holds a valid visa for travel to the U.S.
- 2. If a traveler is a citizen of Australia, Brunei, Japan, New Zealand, South Korea, Singapore, Taiwan, or the United Kingdom and has a current ESTA enrollment.
- 3. If a traveler from PRC holds a valid visa for travel to the U.S. and has a valid EVUS enrollment

Citizens or nationals from the People's Republic of China (PRC) and the Russian Federation are not eligible to travel under the G-CNMI VWP. Rather, Chinese citizens and nationals are required to complete Form I-736 in order to be granted temporary admission into CNMI-only without a visa. While Russian citizens and nationals are required to complete Form I-736 in order to be granted temporary admission without a visa into Guam and CNMI.
