26. Grant projects will be: (a) functional; (b) economical; and (c) not elaborate in design or extravagant in the use of materials, compared with the facilities of a similar type constructed in the State or other applicable geographical area.
27. Standards under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (P.L. 91-576), or State and local codes, if they are more stringent, will be observed in the design and completion of the projects.
28. Grant projects will comply with any applicable requirements under the ADA and section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 regarding accessibility for the disabled.
29. As applicable and to the extent feasible, the design and completion of grant project(s) should maximize efficient use of energy. Standard 90.1-1989 and 90.2-1993 of the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating, and Air-Conditioning Engineers, Inc. (ASHRAE) will be applied in the design and completion of the grant projects.
30. It will follow the "Earthquake Hazards Reduction Act of 1977" (P.L. 95-125) and Executive Order 12699, "Seismic Safety of Federal and Federally Assisted or Regulated New Building Construction," as applicable.
