**Title of Respondent Video: Timeline**

Description: Video uses file and stock footage. Footage includes scenes of parents (with children), teachers, school administrators (principals), and children interacting with ECLS team members during the assessment process.

Graphic elements are incorporated for visual interest and as transitions between live-action scenes. Part of the graphic transitions will include dates (years) that represent the progression of time from 1998, when the ECLS study originated, to 2029, when the new study will conclude. As each “year” graphic comes up on screen, it will include a visual element, like a portion of a timeline, that moves from left to right to indicate the passage of time through the past, present, and future of the study.
