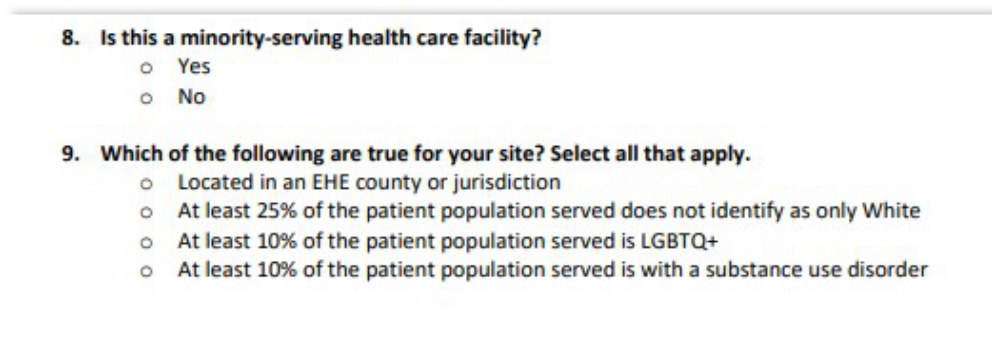
The Southeast AETC has reviewed the tools shared on July 24th, and would like to thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback.

Attached is the PPA as a Word Document with comments. Yellow content are additions/modifications we're suggestion, strike-out font is text we suggest removing. Comments elaborate on our reasoning for each of the suggestions.

Additionally, we had a couple other thoughts that are captured below (we thought it would be easiest to just list these in the email, but please let me know if you prefer notes on the original document).

- We strongly feel that IPE questions should be independent from the PPA. We're concerned that combining them may add confusion to all participants who complete the survey. Our request is to have these four IPE items (starting with "Are you currently in an Interprofessional Education (IPE) program?") in a separate tool that we can send out specifically to IPE students on a routine basis.
- On the IND-PAR, we would like to request **Pharmacist** is added to the list in #4, and **Mental/behavioral health professional** is added to the list in #5
- On the TAR, all responses except one in item #12 have "Skip to question 13" after them. We don't think this is necessary since #13 comes after this item already
