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The CDC needs to stay in their own lane. They should not be controlling any medication, let alone opiates or opiate blockers. The decision of how to treat a patient should solely be up to the provider. There shouldn't be guidelines in place. Since the 2016 MANDATORY "guidelines" were implemented, my health has deteriorated and my pain has increased. The CDC is controlling what my doctors can and cannot do. Is it fair that I was unable to access appropriate pain control after I had a grand mal seizure at the top of a flight of stairs... which resulted in a Le Fort III fracture (detaching my face from my skull) and included breaking my back in 2 places? Is this fair that I had to fight for appropriate pain control while dealing with a MAJOR traumatic injury? I had to fight with the doctors, insurance and the pharmacy. I have been left disabled and my pain is not under control. I can barely work and I can barely function as a wife and mother of 2. I didn't just wake up one day and decide to shoot up heroin. I woke up one day and experienced a debilitating and traumatic medical emergency. Even on the discharge paperwork from the hospital it stated how I was counseled on opiate medications and the need to be weaned off of them shortly. Which was completely unacceptable. I had to have facial reconstruction with 3 plates in my face, 2 broken vertebrae and my jaw was wired shut. I shouldn't have to be counseled on pain medication when I clearly needed it at that moment in time. I wish I could upload the photos of what exactly I looked like. I was severely deformed.
