- Instructions

  1. Enter the total number of employees at this establishment in cell B19.
- 2. Report the job title and a brief description of duties for each employee who worked during the pay period that included <refer\_date>. Report an employee who works in two or more occupations in the job that requires the highest skill level. If there is no difference in skill, report the employee in the occupation in which they spend the most time.
- 3. Report each employee's wage rate. For part-time employees, report an hourly wage rate only. For full-time employees, report an hourly wage rate or annual salary. Please include tips and commissions. Department and worksite location are optional, but providing this information now can reduce the need for follow up phone calls.
- 4. IMPORTANT: Verify that the sum of reported employees in cell B20 matches the number of employees entered in B19. If the numbers don't match, check that the values in the "# of employees" column are correct. See the tab labeled "# of employees column" for examples.
- 5. Save this file and go to HTTPS://IDCFOEWS.BLS.GOV. Provide the requested contact and establishment information, then upload the file.
