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WS has been very important to our operation for many years for taking out predators, coyotes, black bear, and mountain lions, that are killing our livestock, primarily sheep, but also cattle. We do everything that we can, nonlethally, to keep predators from killing our livestock. We employ sheep herders who are with the sheep 24/7. We bed the sheep close to camp. We have very good livestock protection dogs. I say that we would not be in the business if it weren't for the dogs. At times we have used radios and explosive devices to keep predators away. Sometimes there are certain predators that kill our livestock even though we are doing everything we can to keep them away. We need the professionals in WS who know how to kill these predators. Many times the coyote population gets so high that we cannot keep them from killing our livestock. We need professionals who can thin out this population. Without the help of Wildlife Services we would not be in the business today.
