Enter the total number of persons who worked or received pay for any part of the pay period including the 12<sup>th</sup> of the month.

### **Include:**

- Elected or appointed officials
- Full-time or part-time employees
- Trainees
- Employees on paid vacation
- Employees on paid sick leave
- Employees on other paid leave
- Employees on active duty, if receiving pay from employer

### **Exclude:**

- Institution inmates
- Outside contractors and their employees
- Pensioners
- Employees on active duty, if not receiving pay from employer
- Employees on leave without pay the entire pay period
- Employees on strike the entire pay period
- Employees of State and Local school systems
