Camp Lejeune Family Member Program - Reimbursement of Certain Medical Expenses - OMB Control No. 2900-0822

The Camp Lejeune Family Member Program received one comment in response to the 30-Day Federal Register Notice (VA-2025-VACO-0002, FR Doc No: 2025-14570) on August 5, 2025.

ICR 202504-2900-009 – We appreciate the commentor’s concerns-suggestions, and VA responds as follows:

Anonymous Concern/Suggestion: The commenter states that he was born in 1969 while his father was stationed at Camp Lejeune, and he lived in off-base housing with his family for the next 16 months. The period of claimed exposure was from December 1968 to July 1970. The commenter lists several neurological and mental disorders he suffers from, but he has been determined to be ineligible for Camp Lejeune Family Member Program (CLFMP) benefits as he does not meet program requirements. Further, the commenter states that his claim has been reviewed and denied by the Board of Veterans Appeals and appellate courts.

The commenter does ask VA to “Fix your form and take a new look at residence...” We interpret this as the commenter requesting a review of residency requirements used to determine eligibility for CLFMP program benefits.

Program Office Response: This comment is primarily centered on issues with personal eligibility denial for the Camp Lejeune Family Member Program. This commenter has had a thorough review and reconsideration of his claim by VA and the courts. Regarding the residency requirements listed in the Camp Lejeune Family Member Program Application form, these are set under the law governing the CLFMP (38 U.S.C. §1787). The VA is directed to implement this law as written by Congress. The family member applicant must have resided on Camp Lejeune during the relevant time period. Therefore, VA will not make any changes to the application form based upon this comment.

The Camp Lejeune Family Member Program appreciates the opportunity to review and respond to the comments. As noted above, we make no changes to the information collection at this time.
