Item 29. Military medical and health care professionals are not necessarily licensed in the locale where the IRT support partnership takes place. Pursuant to 10 U.S.C. 1049, military medical and healthcare professionals may practice the health profession or professions for which they have an active, unrestricted license at any location in any State, the District of Columbia, or a Commonwealth, territory, or possession of the United States, regardless of where they or the patient are located, as long as the practice is within the scope of their authorized Federal duties.
