Join a 60-minute Building Blocks Focus Group to Improve the Surveillance Data Lifecycle

Why focus groups?

We want to gather input from state, tribal, local, and territorial (STLT) public health agencies to inform the prioritization and design of “Building Blocks” — tools to help public health departments more efficiently and effectively collect, use, analyze, and share surveillance data.

These focus groups will be conducted in a workshop format, where everyone’s voice will be heard.

What do we want to know?

We want to identify STLTs’ pain points and needs along various steps of the surveillance data lifecycle (data access and collection, data orchestration, storage, cleansing and integration, analysis and visualization, dissemination and sharing).

We’ll initially have a topic-centered approach for these groups with a specific focus on: childhood lead poisoning, Legionnaires’ disease, listeria, HIV, and Data Exchange. (*Data Exchange is the platform through which CDC will exchange data with partners and the public; for Data Exchange focus groups, we’re seeking to hear from jurisdictions who report directly to the CDC.).

Who should participate?

We want to hear from STLT public health agency staff who interact with surveillance data at any point along the lifecycle (including but not limited to epidemiologists, IT staff, nurses and administrators).

- Local Health Departments** (LISTERIA DATA):
 - Why are we here?**

The insights you share will be used to inform how the CDC prioritizes and designs future "Building Blocks" — modular software and services that will automate manual processes, in order to create efficiencies and improve decision-making.

Some Building Blocks will offer relatively simple functionality, such as patient name deduplication, while others may perform more complex tasks, such as location services and geocoding, or patient record linking.
 - What information will we gather?**
 - Context around your top data-related frustrations
 - Your ability to generate, manage, and use data for action
 - Recording + Confidentiality**
 - We're recording for the purpose of transcription, analysis, and synthesis.
 - Findings shared from this focus group will be de-identified — not linked with names or health department.
 - By participating, you're agreeing to maintain the confidentiality of the information discussed by participants during the focus group session.
 - Mural and Zoom basics**
 - Double click to type into a post-it

- STEP ONE – INTRODUCTIONS** (5 MIN):
 - Instruction: Pick a color below, then double click a square to type in your first name and your role (e.g., epidemiologist, IT)

- STEP TWO – INDIVIDUAL BRAINSTORMING** (10 MIN):
 - Instruction: Using your colored post-its below, and thinking about listeria data specifically, jot down up to your top 5 frustrations, which impact the ability to generate, manage, and/or use data for action
 - Visual: A 5x5 grid of colored squares (light blue, green, pink, dark blue, yellow, red, light green, purple). - STEP THREE – GROUPING, THEMING, & VOTING** (20 MIN):
 - Instruction: First, we'll move your post-its from Step 2 into this space; read through your peers' post-its, and when you see similar frustrations, group them together. We should end up with multiple groupings of post-its with similar frustrations, while some will stand alone. Second, we'll come up with themes for each group that best represent the frustrations within them. We'll use these themes to help steer our discussion moving forward.
 - Visual: Three groups of yellow sticky notes. "Theme 1" has three notes, "Theme 2" has three notes, and "Theme 3" has two notes. Each note contains the word "Example".
- STEP FOUR – GROUP DISCUSSION** (20 MIN):
 - Instruction: Getting to Impact — If these frustrations were resolved, how would this change your ability to generate, manage, or use data for action?
 - Visual: A single yellow sticky note with the text "Notetaker is creating stickies on this board, based on what participants share".
