CDC-INFO Web-based Satisfaction Survey for People Using Live Chat Service

**PURPOSE:**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) seeks to obtain approval to conduct surveys of customers who use the live chat service of the CDC National Contact Center (CDC-INFO). CDC-INFO will be launching a live chat service to the general public who will reach the contact center through a chat software embedded on the CDC website. The chat widget will live on the main Contact CDC page (<https://www.cdc.gov/cdc-info/index.html>), and offer limited self-service options to get quick answer inquiries on popular topics, such as travelers' health, dog importation, parasitic disease, and COVID-19. If the user is looking for more help than offered by the chat automated answers, they will have the option of reaching a live chat agent when available. The live chat tool will be accessible Monday through Friday between 8 AM and 8 PM ET. Following the interaction, the chat survey will be sent to the inquirer via URL link in the chat messaging widget. The chat survey will be programmed in Survey Monkey or comparable tool. The survey will collect customer feedback on satisfaction with the help they received, how they intend to use the information, and customers' demographic information.

Once the information is collected, CDC-INFO staff will analyze the survey data to

- Collect how many interactions and chats were successfully answered by a live agent before the customer places a phone call or e-mail.
- Monitor satisfaction with CDC-INFO responses and improve program performance.
  - Lower than expected thresholds of reported customer satisfaction with their experience and responses received (whether their health question was answered) will be addressed improving CDC prepared responses and chat process.
- Understand demographics of individuals chatting CDC-INFO for health information, for potential targeted health messaging, and assessing effectiveness of chat as a medium for reaching the public with health information.

**DESCRIPTION OF RESPONDENTS:**

The respondent population are customers that visit the main Contact CDC-INFO page and use the chat tool. The chat tool will offer some self-service options for people to get quick answers to their questions, or they can additionally go on to chat with a live agent when needed, prior to placing a phone call or sending an email.

Our target audience is general public customers who use the chat tool to submit health questions to CDC-INFO. Active consent is required in order to participate in the chat survey at the end of the chat interaction. Inquirers who do not wish to participate in the chat survey can choose not to do so.

We typically receive 2,300 visitors on the main Contact CDC-INFO page per month—that will be the total number of respondents we may expect to receive at maximum. Based on a previous pilot of a chat service that we conducted in 2022, we anticipate getting a 5% response rate on the survey. This equates to 115 respondents per month, or 1380 respondents annually.
