The Permittee hereby constitutes and appoints the Agency Superintendent as his (or their) attorney-in-fact and agrees that in case of any default in the performance of any of the conditions or stipulations of the permit, the attorney-in-fact shall have full power to apply the deposit in the remedy of any damages, demands, or deficiencies arising by reason of such default as he/she may deem best and the Permittee hereby for him/herself, heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, ratifies and confirms all default remedies the attorney-in-fact may invoke by virtue of these presents.
