

Compliance Reporting Tool

To meet Energy Policy Act (EPA) requirements, state and alternative fuel provider [covered fleets](#) must submit an annual report to the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) by December 31 after each model year. For help with reporting, [contact us](#).

Fleets have two options to submit their annual report: through the online Annual Reporting Tool or by submitting a detailed reporting spreadsheet.

Paperwork Reduction Act Burden Disclosure Statement

Notwithstanding any other provision of the law, no person is required to respond to, nor shall any person be subject to a penalty for failure to comply with a collection of information subject to the requirements of the Paperwork Reduction Act unless that collection of information displays a currently valid OMB control number.

Submission of this data is required for covered fleets.

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
