As we go through these mailings, I'm going to ask you to treat each one as you would if it cam to your home. Please go through these as you would at home (as if I were not [here/there]), but I'd like you to say out loud what you are thinking as you look at the mailings.
I'm also going to ask you some questions about the mailings and about your reactions to them. There are no right or wrong answers. I really want to hear your opinions and reactions to thes pieces of mail, so don't hesitate to speak up whenever something is unclear. Please feel free to be honest.
[IF OBSERVER PRESENT]: I want to let you know that this interview is being observed by other Census Bureau staff. They are observing the interview because they are also interested in how the mailings work for people like you.

- 6. [If not mentioned during think aloud] Do you have any feedback about the instructions to respond?
