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Discriminatory 'DEI' practices must end in FAIRNESS to All American Citizens.

The Annual State Application MUST include PROOF of Corrective Actions INCLUDING Transportation and IMEPLEMENTATION of Compensatory Education when ordered in a State Complaint and/or Due Process Cases. I.D.E.A. follows the child/student's RESIDENCE, not 'enrollment'.

School Districts AND LEAs are 'slow walking' ALL matters of required COMPLIANCE for the Receipt of Federal Funding, and these practices are becoming increasingly clear amongst PARENT Support Groups, not POLICY Lobbyist Groups who operate in the interest of Attorneys, NOT Students.

There should be a National OCR on Districts placing the 'Rights and Needs' of Illegal Alien CHILDREN and THEIR Protections FAR ABOVE in practice than U.S. Citizen Children! And implemented with TEETH. As in REMEDY.
