The Survey of Construction produces a variety of statistics on new residential construction and is partially funded by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The survey produces key estimates, such as starts and completions of new single- and multifamily units and sales of new single-family houses. Government and private entities use these statistics to monitor and evaluate the large and dynamic housing construction industry and to make vital economic decisions.
