

Explanation of Information Collection Request without a form

This package is for the OMB approval of the regulations that authorize OPM to collect this information from “*reemployed annuitants*”. The information that may be required from a “*reemployed annuitant*” may vary significantly and may be vastly unique from customer to customer. We don’t have a form that captures all possible required data elements from every “*reemployed annuitant*” because that would overburden the “*reemployed annuitant*” who may have already submitted much of the appropriate information.

This regulation allows the agency to make a “*unique*” collection of only the information needed for a particular customer case and not overburden our customer base by sending a generic form that requires them to possibly review and complete information that we already have access to.

We collect this information from more than 10 members of the public (*reemployed annuitants*), thus it requires the PRA (*Paperwork Reduction Act*) review.

Generic Privacy Act Statement for 3206-0211

Purpose: The information you furnish will be used to identify records properly associated with your application for Federal benefits, to obtain additional information if necessary, to determine and allow present or future benefits, to maintain a uniquely identifiable claim file, and to determine your eligibility to make deposits or redeposits to the Civil Service Retirement and Disability Fund.

Routine Uses: The information requested on this form may be shared externally as a “*routine use*” to other Federal agencies and third-parties when it is necessary to process your application for benefits. For example, OPM may share your information with other Federal, state, or local agencies and organizations in order to determine benefits under their programs, to obtain information necessary for determination or continuation of benefits under this program, or to report income for tax purposes. OPM may also share your information with law enforcement agencies if it becomes aware of a violation or potential violation of civil or criminal law. Consequences of Failure to Provide Information: Providing this information to OPM is voluntary. However, if you fail to provide this information, it may result in a delay or prevent action on your application or render OPM unable to determine your eligibility to make deposits or redeposits for the Civil Service Retirement and Disability Fund.
