2. Provide a brief statement on the specific enforcement action / compliance assistance / communication to your small entity by a federal agency.
3. Submit substantiating documentation (for example: the correspondence, notice, or fine). If this is provided separately by email, fax, or mail, please reference the name of your small entity.
4. If your comment concerns the IRS, you must also submit a completed IRS Tax Information Authorization (Form 8821). This is available at [IRS.gov/forms](https://www.irs.gov/forms).
