

APPLICATION BY LAW SCHOOL FACULTY MEMBER TO BECOME A FACULTY CLINIC SUPERVISOR**Patent Faculty Clinic Supervisor Agreement**

In order to participate in the USPTO Law School Clinic Certification Program ("Program"), each Faculty Clinic Supervisor must sign and submit an agreement to the terms as set forth hereafter. In signing and submitting this agreement to the USPTO, the undersigned agrees to the following:

- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor, the undersigned will perform a conflict of interest check for each participating law school clinic student and each client or potential client of the clinic;
- Law school student clinic practitioners from the participating institution will be supervised by the undersigned and the undersigned assumes full responsibility for all documents submitted by student clinic practitioners with the USPTO, including the content and timeliness of all applications and documents submitted to the USPTO by the clinic;
- Law school student clinic practitioners from the participating institution will be supervised by the undersigned and the undersigned assumes full responsibility for all oral communications by student clinic practitioners with the USPTO;
- All documents signed by law school student clinic practitioners shall be discussed, reviewed, and approved by the undersigned or another approved Faculty Clinic Supervisor from the participating institution prior to submission to the USPTO; participation in the Program requires that all submissions to the USPTO be reviewed and approved by a Faculty Clinic Supervisor prior to filing with the USPTO;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor, the undersigned is responsible for all applications filed with the USPTO by the law school student clinic practitioners in the Program;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor, the undersigned will be listed as an attorney-of-record on all patent applications filed with the USPTO by the clinic through the Program;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor for patents, the undersigned is a registered attorney or agent with the USPTO and possesses at least three (3) years of patent experience in prosecuting patent applications before the USPTO within the last five (5) years;
- The undersigned attests that he or she, along with the law school student clinic practitioners, will read and be familiar with the USPTO ethics rules, the relevant sections of the USPTO's procedural rules, and the USPTO's Program rules, requirements and procedures;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor, the undersigned will maintain a written record of all documents submitted to the USPTO by the clinic through the Program;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor, the undersigned will ensure that law school student clinic practitioners who are admitted to a patent clinic based on design patent practitioner qualifications are restricted to practicing before the USPTO in design patent matters only; and
- Upon request, the undersigned will submit a list of all patent applications in which law school clinic student(s) are currently representing a client before the USPTO.

- All documents signed by law school student clinic practitioners shall be discussed, reviewed, and approved by the undersigned or another approved Faculty Clinic Supervisor from the participating institution prior to submission to the USPTO; participation in the Program requires that all submissions to the USPTO be reviewed and approved by a Faculty Clinic Supervisor prior to filing with the USPTO;
- All trademark applications and documents therein must be filed electronically via the USPTO TEAS system and include the participating institution’s assigned tracking code; the clinic agrees to conduct communication with the USPTO electronically;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor, the undersigned is responsible for all applications filed with the USPTO by the law school student clinic practitioners in the Program;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor, the undersigned will be listed as an attorney-of-record on all trademark applications filed with the USPTO by the clinic through the Program;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor for trademarks, the undersigned is a licensed attorney in good standing with the highest court of a State and possesses at least three (3) years of trademark experience in prosecuting trademark applications before the USPTO within the last five (5) years;
- The undersigned attests that he or she, along with the law school student clinic practitioners, will read and be familiar with the USPTO ethics rules, the relevant sections of the USPTO’s procedural rules, and the USPTO’s Program rules, requirements and procedures;
- As a Faculty Clinic Supervisor, the undersigned will maintain a written record of all documents submitted to the USPTO by the clinic through the Program; and
- Upon request, the undersigned will submit a list of all trademark applications in which law school clinic student(s) are currently representing a client before the USPTO.
