## General Comment

Please place remittance taxes on all illegals who have brought measles and other diseases into the United States. The measles outbreak (now over 800 cases) in South Carolina stems from a Ukrainian enclave outside of Spartanburg full of illegal migrants who never received a measles vaccine. Now South Carolina children are at risk because you refuse to close the border AND you refuse to impose punishment on migrants who enter the United States diseased. There are no quarantine facilities addressing the South Carolina measles outbreak. Fix this now, before children die. As of Feb. 3, 2026, DPH is reporting 876 cases of measles centered around Spartanburg County. The majority of cases are close contacts of known cases. However, the number of public exposure sites indicates that measles is circulating in the community increasing the risk of exposure and the risk of infection for those who are not immune due to vaccination or natural infection. The South Carolina DPH will post measles updates twice a week, at 1 p.m. on Tuesday and Friday. In time, this update frequency may change to more or less each week depending on disease activity.
