Approval of Revised Terms “Generator Owner” and “Generator Operator”
Used in NERC Reliability Standards and Request for Expedited Action

Dear Ms. Perotti and Mr. Rigaud:

On August 27, 2025, the North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) filed a petition seeking approval of revised definitions for the terms Generator Owner and Generator Operator for inclusion in the Glossary of Terms used in NERC Reliability Standards (NERC Glossary) and the proposed implementation plan.

NERC explains that the primary purpose of these revisions is to align the definitions of the Generator Owner and Generator Operator terms in the NERC Glossary with the recently revised Generator Owner and Generator Operator registration functions in the NERC Rules of Procedure Statement of Compliance Registry Criteria,¹ approved by the Commission on June 27, 2024.² NERC states that the proposed revisions to the

NERC Glossary definitions of Generator Owner and Generator Operator are necessary to enhance Bulk-Power System reliability by expanding the applicability of Reliability Standards to owners and operators of IBRs meeting the Category 2 criteria.³

NERC's filing was noticed on August 28, 2025, with interventions, comments and protests due on or before September 26, 2025. Calpine Corporation filed a motion to intervene. No comments or protests were filed. The timely-filed motion to intervene is granted pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.214.

NERC's uncontested filing is hereby approved pursuant to the relevant authority delegated to the Director of the Office of Electric Reliability under 18 C.F.R. § 375.303, effective as of the date of this order.

This action shall not be construed as approving any other application pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 375.303(a)(2)(i). Such action shall not be deemed as recognition of any claimed right or obligation associated therewith and such action is without prejudice to any findings or orders that have been or may hereafter be made by the Commission in any proceeding now pending or hereafter instituted by or against the Electric Reliability Organization or any Regional Entity.

This order constitutes final agency action. Requests for rehearing by the Commission may be filed within 30 days of the date of issuance of this order, pursuant to 18 C.F.R. § 385.713.
