As a veterinary student, I strongly support APHIS’s request to extend approval of the information collection related to equine infectious anemia (EIA). Accurate testing, laboratory oversight, and documentation are critical tools for preventing the spread of this serious and incurable disease and for protecting the health of the U.S. equine population.

The information collected under these regulations has clear practical value for disease surveillance, diagnostic reliability, and safe interstate movement of horses. From a veterinary education and public health perspective, these requirements reinforce best practices in biosecurity, accountability, and evidence-based disease control.

The estimated reporting burden appears reasonable given the importance of early detection and containment of EIA. Continued efforts to expand electronic and streamlined reporting would further support veterinarians, laboratories, and producers while maintaining strong animal health protections.
