

NOAA Ocean Exploration Internship/Fellowship Longitudinal Survey (2026 Update)

Purpose:

The purpose of this longitudinal survey is to track the ongoing experiences and progress of participants in NOAA Ocean Exploration's internship and fellowship programs over time. By gathering data at multiple points throughout the internship and beyond, this survey aims to assess the long-term impact of the programs on participants' professional development, learning outcomes, career trajectories, and overall satisfaction. The information collected will provide valuable insights into how the program influences participants' growth and career readiness, helping to refine and enhance the structure and effectiveness of future internship and fellowship offerings.

Description of Respondents:

The respondents of this survey are alumni of NOAA Ocean Exploration's internship and fellowship programs who are at least three years removed from their participation. These individuals were involved in the previous program cycle (not the most recent) and are providing feedback based on their long-term career development and the impacts of their internship experiences. The participants include students and early-career professionals who participated in the Explorer-in-Training program as well as other NOAA-wide internship and fellowship programs (e.g., Knauss Marine Policy Fellowship, Hollings Scholarship, Lapenta Internships, etc.). Survey respondents may range from students and early-career professionals to more seasoned professionals across various sectors. The survey will be distributed to all program alumni every three years via email to the alumni contact list.
