	When Should I File Form I-485?		Instructions page 3	<b>Principal Applicant</b> In general, if you are filing as a beneficiary of an immigrant visa petition (such as Form I-130, Petition for Alien Relative, Form I-140, Immigrant Petition for Alien Workers, or Form I-360, Petition for Amerasian, Widow(er), or Special Immigrant), you may file an adjustment application only after USCIS has approved your petition and an immigrant visa number is immediately available. There are, however, some immigrant categories that allow you to file Form I-485 before USCIS approves your petition (this is known as "concurrent filing"), provided that approval of the petition would make an immigrant visa number immediately available to you and you meet all other filing and eligibility requirements. <a href="#">Learn more about concurrent filing</a> . You may file at any of the following times: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• At the same time the principal applicant files Form I-485;</li><li>• After the principal applicant filed a Form I-485 that remains pending a final decision by USCIS;</li><li>• After USCIS approves the principal applicant's Form I-485, if the principal applicant is still a lawful permanent resident and if, at the time of the principal applicant's Form I-485 approval, you were the principal applicant's spouse or child; or</li><li>• After the principal applicant obtained an immigrant visa and entered the United States as a lawful permanent resident if the principal applicant is still a lawful permanent resident and, at the time of the principal applicant's entry, you were the principal applicant's spouse or child.</li></ul> Generally, USCIS cannot approve your Form I-485 as a derivative applicant until the principal applicant obtains lawful permanent resident status.
