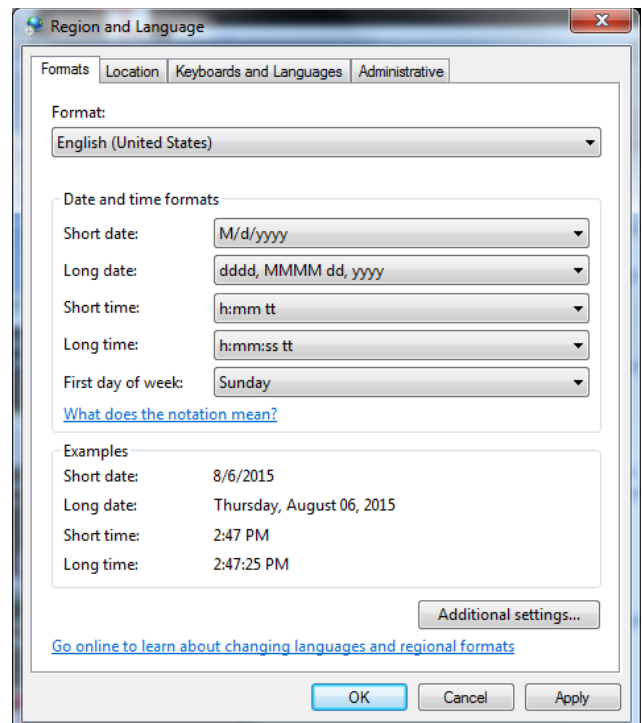
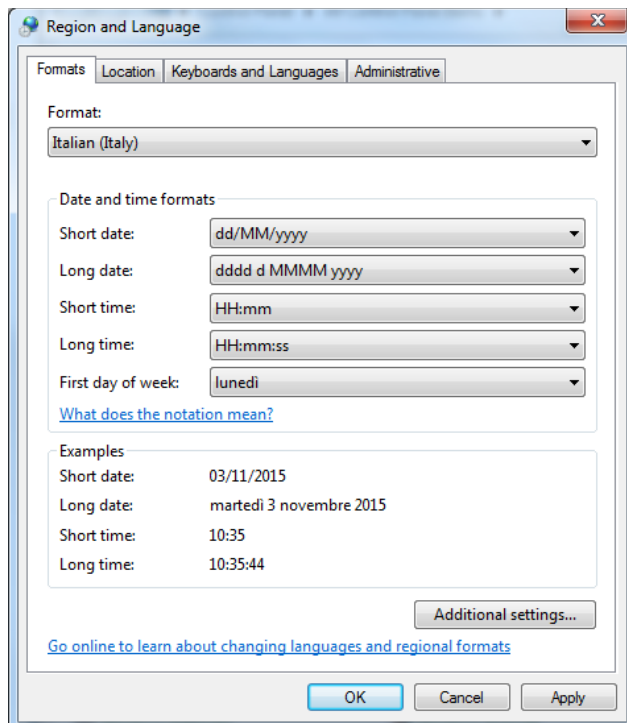
Correcting Valid number error messages.
