- C. Agrees to allow the Government or its representative access to the property for servicing the Borrower's account, which may include repossession of the Government's security.
- D. Agrees that this subordination covers the amount actually loaned by the Government to the Borrower (principal and accrued interest), and any extensions, renewals or modifications thereof, future advances for taxes, insurance, payment of prior liens, protection of the security, and the amount actually advanced for foreclosure costs made by the Government.
- E. Agrees that this subordination covers any future loan(s) made by the Government to the Borrower (principal and accrued interest) and any extensions, renewals or modifications thereof, future advances for taxes, insurance, payment of prior liens, protection of the security, and the amount actually advanced for foreclosure costs incurred by the Government.
